THE 20 MINUTE PORTRAIT

**Richard A. Stergulz**



Richard is an Illinois native who by the age of eight knew he wanted to be an artist. He graduated from the American Academy of

Art in Chicago in 1983 which began his successful commercial art career. After 12 years of doing commercial art, Richard felt it was time to fine tune his fine art style.

Richard moved to California in 1995 and started painting for himself in a realistic style with a touch of Russian impressionism. "I admire the Russian Impressionists, especially Nickolai Fechin, for their intense brush strokes that exude passion into their paintings. I also admire Norman Rockwell for his amazing drawing ability and the volume of work he produced in his lifetime." Lastly, Richard admires John Singer Sargent for his portrait work. "His portraits give a sense of reality but still have a painterly style which I hope to aspire to."

Richard works in oils on masonite board. His work is mostly figurative and he

has started plein air painting as much as possible. He also teaches class three times a week as well as doing demos for most of the Art Associations in San Diego and Riverside counties.

Richard's work hangs in galleries in Cody Wyoming, Santa Monica, Idyllwild and Fallbrook California. His paintings have won numerous awards from Best of Show to People's Choice.

### Art Assist Program thanks Rotary Club of Fallbrook

The Rotary Club of Fallbrook has gifted the Art Assist Program with a check for \$1200. Penny Fedorchak and Carol Zaleski received the check from then President, Dave Kauffman at their weekly

luncheon on June 26th. Art Assist director, Shirley Williams, said the funds will be used for supplies and mats which are needed for lessons and showcasing the artwork for the coming year. The Rotary Club of Fallbrook has been generous to the Art Assist Program in the past and once again deserves thanks for their generosity.

### WHAT IS THE MARY LA HUE ART ASSIST PROGRAM OF THE FALLBROOK ART ASSOCIATION?

Mary La Hue designed and created the Art Assist Program in 1992 with Fallbrook Art Association volunteers teaching art principles each month to 5th or 6th graders at local elementary schools. The need for enhanced art education in schools made it an instant success.

Two-person volunteer teams teach art to 6th graders in local schools - The FAA artists teach art to the class while the regular teacher stays in the classroom. Basic art and design principles are emphasized in these lessons, and the best pieces of artwork from each class are then selected for two shows held in the Spring of each year - one in the Juvenile Room at the Fallbrook Public Library and one at the Brandon Gallery in the Etcetera Room. Over 90 pieces are chosen for these two shows.

Mary retired from running Art Assist in 2000 when Penny Fedorchak and Carol Zaleski assumed direction of the program through 2006-2007. Penny and Carol are still active in finding operational funding for the program. Beth Taft and Shirley Williams were responsible for the

direction of the program through 2007-2008, and Shirley, with the help of Don Hambric, will be directing through this present school year. This year we are concentrating our teaching efforts in the Mary Fay Pendleton School at Camp Pendleton.

For over 15 years, this program has been effectively enriching art education for hundreds of students. These lessons truly inspire creativity, art enjoyment and the way the children view the world.

Please consider volunteering for this worthwhile program - it is of enormous benefit to the children participating in it. You need only teach one Wednesday morning of the year to two classes - 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. You get to select the lesson, provide the materials (paid for by Art Assist) and teach the lesson to very enthusiastic children - with additional help provided by another Art Assist volunteer.

The faculty at Mary Fay Pendleton school is also interested in having us teach additional grades on other days of the week except Fridays if we can get enough teachers - so if another day would be better for you please let us know.
