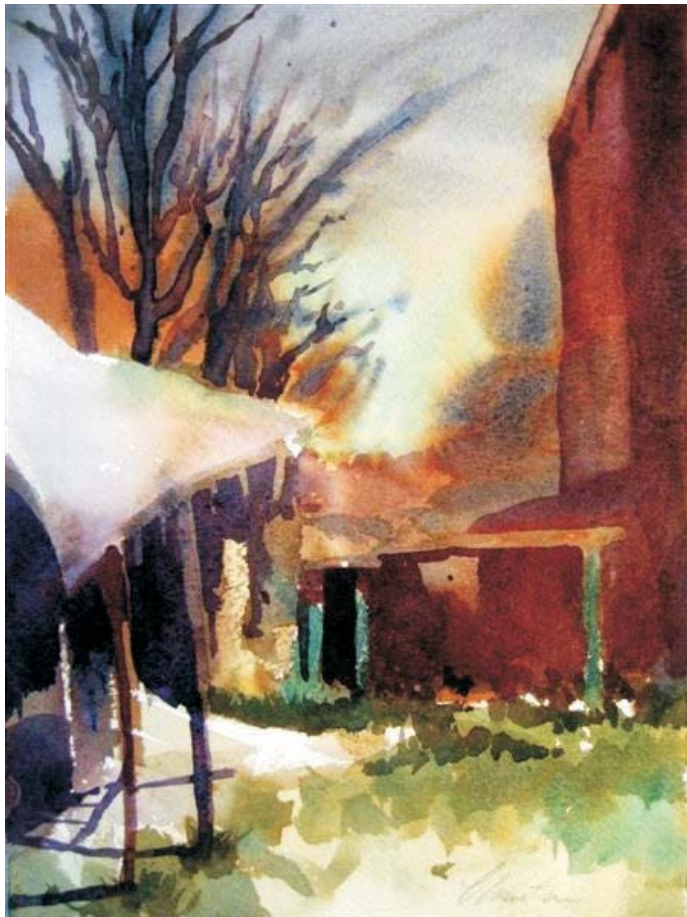

## President's Message



Welcome to a new and exciting 2008-09 season with Fallbrook Art Association! I want to encourage you to jump in and use your creative energies to make this the best year

ever. Do you know anyone who would enjoy our monthly demonstrations and workshops? Be sure to let them know ASAP, because we're kicking off the fall season with our all-member show at the Art Center...before we even meet for the first time in September! That means you and your friends can take advantage of a FULL YEAR of membership instead of holding off until Spring or late Fall! Be sure to enter one or 2 pieces and get involved by either sitting the show for a few hours or finding some other way to participate. It's a lot of fun!

Since the fall show is for members only, you may have already heard that we have been informed by a knowledgeable Certified Public Accountant, who has had many years of experience with the I.R.S., that we must make certain changes in order to protect our Charitable Non-Profit status.

The accountant told us that, although we are allowed to hold fundraisers and make and keep money as an organization, individual members are not allowed, by law, to benefit monetarily from their membership whenever non-members are excluded. We may no longer offer cash prizes or even donated goods or services of

monetary value at these members only shows, nor can we offer members' work for sale at these shows.

So, during this show, we will provide a notebook at the front desk for members to include pertinent information about themselves and their work. If we want to make our contact information available for interested visitors, we can include that along with a short bio and/or artist's statement. Feel free to list your pieces along with any interesting facts about what inspired you to produce them the way you did, your phone number and/or email address, etc. You can even add photos!

FAA will be striving to make this an especially classy event. Winners will receive Award Ribbons in eight different categories and receive recognition in newspapers and on the Internet throughout Riverside and San Diego Counties. We've hired a caterer who promises to provide us with an elegant array of scrumptious hors d'oeuvres. We are also pre-paying the estimated admissions to the Art Center so everyone can see the show for free.

You'll see in the accountant's letter that another change dictated by law is that all FAA-sponsored workshops must be made available to non-members as well as members with only a slight difference in fee. So, from now on, all-day workshops will be offered to members at \$30 and non-members at \$35.

Please take advantage of your membership by embracing these changes and making a difference in the community by encouraging your friends, family and neighbors to join you at our meetings and events.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Ms. Patricia Hartman and I had a meeting at my office on April 19, 2008. This letter summarizes our meeting and the recommendations I make to your organization.

Fallbrook Art Association has been recognized with tax-exempt organization status as a 501(c) (3) based upon your letter from the IRS dated January 22, 1974. You have advised me that your gross receipts are normally not over \$25,000 and you have not had a return filing requirement prior to 2007. You are aware and have met the filing requirement for the new Form 990N e-postcard for the 2007 calendar year. You are also required to file Form RRF-1 with the California Office of the Attorney General within four months and fifteen days after the end of your accounting period. You can access this form at the following website; <http://ag.ca.gov/charities/forms.php>

As stated in your letter, donors may obtain a tax deduction for contributions to your organization. Your letter indicates that your members cannot deduct membership fees as contributions. The IRS determination letter also stated that "this determination is predicated upon the fact that no picture sales of members will be made at your shows. This would constitute inurement and would jeopardize your exemption."

The doctrine of private inurement is one of the most important sets of rules constituting the law of tax-exempt organizations. This private inurement doctrine is a statutory criterion for the federal tax exemption for 13 categories of exempt organizations. By having a show and only including your members' art is in conflict with the private inurement doctrine and, as the IRS stated in their letter, jeopardizes your exemption.

The IRS and the courts have recognized that charities endeavoring to advance education such as promoting and encourage the talent of young artists. Organizations in this category frequently promote and finance their charitable function thru the sponsorship of public festivals, concerts, exhibits, and other productions. The courts have ruled that, although the displaying of artworks is often a charitable activity, an organization will not achieve exemption as a charitable entity where it sells the artworks it exhibits and remits the proceeds to the artists. The fact the exhibited artwork is available for sale, however,

the proceeds to the artists. The fact the exhibited artwork is available for sale, however, will not necessarily deprive the organization sponsoring the show of exemption as a charitable activity.

The Courts indicate the difference in commercial art galleries and non-profit art shows are the profit objective. Commercial galleries are operated to make a profit. They choose the artist, subject matter, ticket cost, and length of period of display, with an objective of payment of the cost of the event and to make a profit. Tax-exempt organizations do not operate to make a profit. They focus on serving the community broadly; developing new works of art; provide educational programs and opportunity for new talent. Based upon my meeting with Ms. Hartman, this appears to be the way your organization has operated the limited number of shows you sponsor each year.

I would recommend that you consider changes in your shows. Both members and non-members must be allowed to participate in your shows. Sales should be made directly by the artist and not by your organization. You have indicated that the local Fallbrook Village Association has been concerned that allowing the artist to make sales at your shows is being done to circumvent sales tax laws. However, if you provide them a copy of your exemption letter and this letter, they may be persuaded to change their decision.

You cannot give a member a significantly lower entry fee for your shows than a non-member. There may be a de minimus benefit to your members at the shows. You need to work with your membership to make sure they realize the primary benefit of membership is your educational programs that you provide at little cost and are not designed to make a profit for the organization. You need to work to attract non-members at your shows, so there is not an appearance that the shows are provided primarily to benefit your members.

I realize attempting to meet these requirements may not please all your members. However, failure to do so risks your tax-exempt status and could result in the loss of your grants.

I am willing to meet with you to discuss these issues and attempt to answer questions.

### Alison Christler

Fine art was interspersed with a broad range of design projects, including residential and commercial interior design, fabric, furniture and architectural design, a book cover (The Last City, by Roger Burke).

After moving to Los Angeles in the early 1980's, she continued her fine art studies in oil painting under Sergei Bongart.

Alison moved to San Diego County in the mid-90's and began studying watercolor with Sandra Bray and taking workshops at the San Diego Watercolor Society (Robbie Laird, Al Brouillette, Frank Webb, Gerald Brommer, Joan McKasson, Carole Barnes, Cheng-Khee Chee, Skip Lawrence, Serge Hollerbach, Linda Doll, Barbara Nechis, Frank Francese, Tom Fong) and outside SDWS, Charles Reid, Alex Powers, Katherine Chang Liu, Elaine Harvey and Milford Zornes.

Since 1999, Alison has been a full-time artist, winning many local awards, and participating in art exhibitions in the Southern California area. Her oil painting has been hugely influenced by studying for three years with Sebastian Capella.

Alison now teaches both oil and watercolor locally, organizes art trips to Europe, demonstrates for Southern California art organizations, and juries art exhibits. She holds a B.A. in psychology from UCLA with a particular interest in visual perception as it relates to art.
