Renee Corwin is an award winning portrait painter. A native New Yorker, Renee attended The School of Visual Arts in New York City where she earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree. Influenced by such great artists as John Singer Sargent, Bouguereau and Ingres just to name a few and contemporaries such as Daniel Greene, Richard Schmid, David Leffel, Michael Shane Neal, Susan Sprung, Quang Ho and Michael Steirnagle, Renee paints in a style of realism. Her professional career started as textile artist where she was a colorist and designer in the garment district in Manhattan for two decades. In her working career she has also worked as a graphic designer. Always the consummate designer, she works with endless dedication to each piece she tackles. Her move to San Diego brought her back to her first joy, painting. As a way to stay spiritually connected to her family, Renee began painting portraits from photos of her family members who were now 3,000 miles away. She enjoyed portrait painting so much that she decided to focus on just that, and a passion was created. Renee has won numerous awards for her portrait work, most recently at the San Diego County Fair and 2011 Members Show of the San Diego Portrait Society. She has been in numerous group show and a solo show in Rancho Santa Fe. One of her winning pieces also hangs in the permanent collection in the library at Mesa College. Renee's works are in private collections in Northern and Southern California, Washington, Colorado, Florida and New York. Renee is the president of the San Diego Portrait Society and a member of the CA Art Club the Portrait Society of America and the LJAA.

TO ALL FAA MEMBERS: We will be changing the art exhibit in the lobby of the Bob Burton Center for Performing Arts at Fallbrook High School, 2400 S. Stagecoach Lane, cross street South Mission. The Performing Arts Center (Theater) is located just east of the school buildings near the baseball field.

WE CAN ACCEPT NO MORE THAN 36 PIECES OF ART DUE TO SPACE LIMITATION ON A FIRST COME BASIS. ENTRY/PICK-UP IS ONE DAY ONLY!!

We are working under a time restriction for the day, due to school staffing constraints, so please read the following information carefully. The schedule is planned as follows: 9:30 AM – 2:00PM pick up and/or enter new art work. This will be the only time period we have open for artists to pick up their art that has been in the gallery since April 2, 2011 and to submit new work for the next six month period. Artwork will not be accepted after 2:00PM, so that hanging the piece will proceed as smoothly and quickly as possible. ALL ARTWORK, which has been in the gallery since April 2, must be taken out by the artists no later than 2:00 PM Saturday, October 22.

THEME: No Particular theme, just good fine art from FAA Members. Those pieces which depict “Performing Arts” are particularly welcome in this exhibit.

THIS IS NOT A JURIED EVENT – Limit two (2) pieces per member on a first come basis, as we can accept no more than 36 pieces. All artwork submitted for exhibit must be suitable for general viewing. Paintings must be dry, framed adequately, and ready to hang with wire attached. No saw tooth hangers. ARTIST NAME, PHONE NUMBER AND TITLE OF ART ON BACK OF EACH PIECE (REQUIRED). Cost for the six month period is \$5.00 for each piece of art. Cash or check made payable to the “Fallbrook Art Association”, on delivery of your artwork for exhibit. A 10% commission is payable by the artist, to the “Bob Burton Center for the Performing Arts” for any artwork sold during the showing. The artist, not the FAA, is responsible for any sales tax on items involved in any transaction in this event. We expect to change the art again in 6 months, about April of 2012. Anyone who can volunteer, we always need help for the day. To volunteer, or if you have questions, please contact **Marlene Sheridan at 760-731-3064**. Space allotment and cost per artist will be as follows. Approx. \$140. each for a 6x10 wall space. Bonnie can provide grids for artwork for 2 walls and will need 3 more 6x10 “walls”. Included in the cost is a 10 x 20 foot tent setup and one image of your art to appear on the web page for advertisement. Signage of FAA group will also be included, and a link to our web site.

Artist must have a valid California Sellers Permit (state sales tax license) and have it posted in their booth during Festival hours. Artist is responsible for collecting and reporting sales tax.
