



Volunteers Needed

The Fallbrook Art Association, now in its 51st year, is run, like most other non-profits, by volunteers. Your volunteer board members handle the day-to-day / month-to-month business that supports the activities we all enjoy. Less than 8% of our total membership handles the business of this non-profit, which must be run in accordance with its articles of incorporation and pertinent state laws. Additional volunteers sign up to help organize and produce our four yearly shows, two of which are regional art events. Less than 15% of our total membership is represented in the volunteers that step forward to handle our routine and special events. Our Board was never properly staffed over the last 1 ½ years, and a number of board members, including myself, have been handling multiple positions. That is not good business practice and it is a good way to burn out volunteers fast. I ask old and new members alike, to consider the importance of this organization to themselves as an individual, and to the greater community as well. The FAA needs your active participation as a volunteer Board member and/or, as a volunteer supporting our special events.

Positions for the 2014 board term/ membership year are:

Officers:

1st Vice President- Current 1st VP is Carol Reardon, who will become president in January. The 1st VP is customarily the president- in- training.

2nd Vice President- Ruth Parker has agreed to take this position through the current term and continue through 2014.

Treasurer: Francine Pender has agreed to serve as acting treasurer to complete Ayn Bryant's term and has indicated her willingness to continue through 2014.

Born in Kyoto, Japan, Keiko Tanabe embarked on a professional art career in 2005 and started exhibiting publicly after a long career in international relations in a Japanese government trade organization in Tokyo, at a large law firm in San Francisco and at a private consulting firm in San Diego. After learning basic drawing and watercolor skills at a



school in San Diego, she took on her first project as an artist with her father, a renowned scholar of French literature in Japan. A book authored by him and illustrated by Keiko about Provence was published in August, 2003.

In the last 25 years, she has traveled extensively, mainly in European countries, Asia and North America. In the summer of 2009, she was chosen to participate in the 4ème Biennale de l'Aquarelle in Brioude, France, as the first exhibitor from the United States. A signature member of National Watercolor Society and is also a member of American Watercolor Society, Japan Watercolor Society and founding member of North American Watercolor Artists (NAWA), Keiko has won many major watercolor awards across North America and in Asia and Europe.

ELIGIBILITY: FAA membership is not required to participate. All works must be dry and suitable for general viewing. Works entered must not have been shown in a previous FAA show. All work must be original. Limit of 2 entries per artist. **All entrants must register to sit the Gallery for 3 hrs. If an entrant is unable to gallery sit, he / she must pay a fee of \$25 for a sitter provided by FAC.**

SPECIFICATIONS: Artist's name, phone number, title of work and asking price must be legibly printed on back of each entry. **NO** saw-tooth hangers. All work must have screw eyes and wire (ends taped) strong enough for weight of piece. Maximum framed width, including diptychs and triptychs, is 50". No height limit. 3-dimensional piece maximum weight is 50 lbs. Paintings, photos, graphics, computer works and mixed media **may be covered with glass if the size is 30"x30" or less** (excluding frame). **Plexiglas is required on larger pieces** – except on pastels and charcoal works. No work may be removed from the gallery until the close of the show
