has several committees working on this dynamic show. Receiving day is on Monday, November 7th. *The Reception and presentation of Awards is on Friday the 11th* from 6 to 8 pm. It's fascinating to see how we put together our shows from the organization of the Receiving Day Committee to the efficiency of the Judging Committee, to placement, hanging, lighting and decorating for the show. Another exciting event we are all looking forward to is the **Art of the Book Festival**. FAA artists will be showing and selling their art to the throngs expected to attend Fallbrook's newest festival. Friends of the Fallbrook Library will be joined by many other Friends groups from all across southern California. They will be selling their special collections of first edition books, and rare and collectable books. There will be authors signing their own work, new book sellers, a book binding demonstration, two writer's workshops, live entertainment and shuttle bus service to the plein air art show at Myrtle Creek Nursery. Many downtown businesses, restaurants and galleries will be open. The Brandon Gallery will be pre-

senting an Art of the Book show. In the Village Square there will be glass blowing demonstrations and potters doing their magic with clay. The Festival is free and the hours are from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. The main Festival site will be in the parking area behind the Art & Cultural Center (now called The Art Center at Fallbrook) on Alvarado between Main and Mission in historic downtown Fallbrook.

I want to say thank you to two very hard working volunteers: Brigitta Fox and Janice Jones. These two women have been working all summer long getting the FAA lending library ready for our use and enjoyment. The next time you check out one of the new DVD's, videos or books be sure to thank them for making it possible.

October Demonstration – Fealing Lin Monday, October 10th 7 p.m.

The demonstrator at our October workshop will be award-winning watercolor artist Fealing Lin. Her passionate pursuit of the transparency that makes traditional watercolors glow from the light of white paper emerging through the wet-on-wet paint brings an extraordinary sense of aliveness to her work. She began her artistic journey in Taiwan, where she was a protégé of renowned professor Ching-Jung Chen. Pursuing her career in the United States, she studied for a time under senior art historian professor Verna Wells. Fealing now makes her home in San Marino. Her fluid watercolors combine realism, impressionistic strokes and semi-abstract techniques. The President of the Royal Watercolor Society of England, William Blackshaw, says, “Fealing Lin paints poems that vibrate with light and color...long may she continue to delight the eye and move the spirit.”

Spontaneous and inspired, her watercolors actually glow, some say.

Now a teacher and an active exhibitor, Fealing is an annual guest instructor at Yosemite National Park, an instructor at Brand Library in Glendale, and an annual exhibitor at Descanso Gardens, one of the most beautiful and prestigious garden in Southern California. “To be true to her gift,” says Fealing, “an artist needs to be both inspired and inspiring – expressing her love, her passion, her strength, and her belief in the human spirit.” Fealing will participate in the Eat ‘n Critique at 5:30, so feel free to bring along your own works in progress. After a brief business meeting, Fealing will demonstrate her watercolor techniques and has offered to donate something for our raffle, too. I’m sure we’ll find it a ravishing evening.

***My basic palette of watercolors:**

Ultramarine Blue
Cerulean Blue
Cobalt Blue
Turquoise Blue
Prussian Blue
Green Gold
Thalo Green
Aureolin Yellow (Lemon Yellow)
New Gamboge
Quinacridone Gold
Raw Sienna
Burnt Sienna
Permanent Rose
Permanent Alizarin Crimson
Quinacridone Magenta
Quinacridone Burnt Orange
Opera
Permanent Violet Bluish

*Please use the palette of colors you are most familiar with -I use brushes as large as possible, both round and flat.

My favorites are 2", 1 1/2", 1", 1/2" flat and #12 round. Riggers, old oil brushes, tooth brushes, and palette knives are very useful for me. -D'arches 140 lb. cold press in sheets or blocks are the ones I always have in my paper drawer, but I use all kinds of brands of sketch books. Please bring your sketches or photos for inspiration.

A unique and vibrant Festival is planned and will be extensively advertised in media throughout Southern California. Visitors will enjoy festivities including our talented artists, acoustical music, Main Street's gourmet bistros, and many Friends of the Library Associations throughout Southern California will offer for sale their collections of rare books. Other activities will include writer's workshops, book-binding demos and visiting authors' booths. Other Village activities will include "Art of the Book" at the Brandon Gallery, "Sculpture on an Intimate Scale" at the Art Center and shuttles will be provided to the "Plein Air Show" at Myrtle Creek Nursery.

This Festival is expected to be as successful as the Art of the Flower Festival in April where our artists sold over \$3,600 worth of paintings. The Festival site will be South of Alvarado Street between the Fallbrook Library and the Art Center at Fallbrook.

FAA will provide booth space for 40 artists. Each artist will have a 4' x 8' panel to display their art. The space will be allotted on a first come, first served basis and booths will be arranged in a fashion to allow for optimum exposure. There is a non-refundable entry fee of \$12.50 per artist and a 20% commission on all sales will be donated to the Friends of the Fallbrook Library Building Fund.

Open to all artists. Limit of three entries per artist. The works presented must have been done in the past three years and not shown in a previous FAA show.

All work must be original by the artist.

Non-members: Each entry \$20.00

In categories with few entries the number of awards may be limited.

SPECIFICATIONS:

All work must be dry, framed securely, with screweyes and wire attached, ready to hang. No sawtooth hangers. Artist name, phone number, titles on back of each. Total length on any one side including frame shall not exceed 54 inches. Diptychs or triptychs considered as one work. Three-dimensional works weighing more than 50 pounds, the artist is responsible for placement in the show and for removal. No size limit on three-dimensional stand alone works, but must be of reasonable size, Show Chairs will determine. Paintings, photos, graphics, computer works and mixed media may be covered with glass if the size is 24"x24" or less excluding frame. Plexiglas is required on larger pieces, pastels and charcoal works exempted. Gallery wraps, ends finished.

ALL WORK ENTERED MUST BE SUITABLE FOR GENERAL VIEWING.

COMMISSIONS

A 20% commission on ALL sales resulting from this show shall be made to the Fallbrook Art Association.
