FAA membership not required but members receive favorable rates--Members: 1st piece \$20, 2nd piece \$10, Non-members, 1st piece \$30, 2nd piece \$15. Student rates, member, 1st piece \$5, 2nd piece \$5, non member \$10 and \$5 (must show student ID). **May join FAA at entry.**

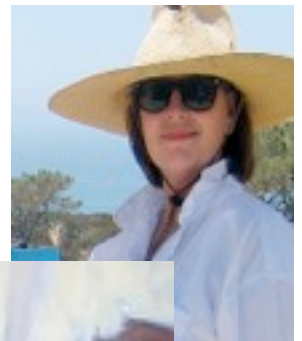
Categories: A. Oil and Acrylic; B. Watermedia (under glass or plexiglass); C. Mixed Media, FiberArt; D. Pencil, Colored Pencil, Charcoal, Pastel, and Ink; E. Printmaking and Computer Generated Art; F. Photography (film or digital), including Enhanced; G. 3D / Sculpture.

Specifications: Artist's name, phone number, title of work and price must be printed on back of each entry. All work must have screw eyes and wire (ends taped). No saw-tooth hangers. Maximum framed width, including diptychs and triptychs, is 50". No height limit. Three-dimensional piece maximum weight is 50 lbs. Paintings, photos, graphics, computer works and mixed media **may be covered with glass if the size is 30"x30" or less** (excluding frame). **Plexiglas is required on pieces over 30 x 30 "** – except on pastels and charcoal works.

No work may be removed from the gallery until the close of the show. **Sales** will be administered by FAC which will retain a 25% commission. Artwork will be handled with reasonable care. FAC and FAA are not responsible for damages, theft or loss. All entries being received are subject to these conditions. **Insurance is the responsibility of each artist.**

NEW THIS YEAR: All entrants must register to sit the gallery for 3 hours. If unable to sit, you may pay a fee of \$25 for a sitter provided by the Art Center. This policy has become necessary due to the difficulty of finding volunteers to sit the show for its duration. It is a policy successfully used by other art organizations and galleries. Please help it work for us. Many thanks.

Judge: Catherine Grawin is a native Californian who calls herself an impressionist oil painter using true colors and bold, loose brush strokes. She received a BA from SDSU in graphic design and communications and did post grad work in architectural design and rendering. Her art is found in the book, *Land of Sunshine* and a filmed documentary called *Plein Air Painters of Santa Ysabel*. Her work is represented in the Santa Ysabel Art Gallery and Cosmopolitan Fine Arts in La Jolla. A long list of awards appears on her website including first prize at the San Diego County Fair.

IMPORTANT!! Time to Raise the Dues

FAA has not increased membership dues for many years. Currently, the activities we support, monthly demonstrations and workshops, fall and spring shows at the Art Center, the biannual hanging of member paintings at the Burton Center for the Performing Arts and others are straining our balance sheet.

The board has found it necessary to increase the membership, effective 2014. The collection of dues will begin on the entry day of the fall show, Nov. 4. Individual membership will be \$45, family membership \$55 and life membership \$450.

We urge members to agree to receive the newsletter by email but can oblige those who want to receive printed copies in the mail. The cost to receive a printed copy, however, will be an additional \$20. This amount covers the cost of printing and mailing monthly hard-copy newsletters. It does not add to FAA coffers. It only meets expenses.

As in the past, you may join at the time of entry into art shows or renew by mailing your dues to the FAA post office box. Even if you’re renewing and we have you on record, please complete the updated membership form on the last page of this newsletter so we can keep your information current.
