In 2011, the Fallbrook Art Association received a bequest of paintings from the estate of BJ Wilson. The paintings, of exceptional quality, are wonderfully representative of her prolific career as a painter, lecturer and art-travel leader. The FAA, of which BJ was especially fond, was extremely grateful for this donation and held several exhibits of her art, hosted by Brandon Gallery, in which many of these works were sold. The FAA donated remaining unsold works to the Brandon Gallery, which was another organization that BJ held dear.

BJ received a BA from UCLA, and a Master's Degree in Painting from the Art Center School, Chouinard Art Institute. She taught at Santa Monica College, Montgomery County College, MD, and the American University in Washington DC. She was frequently asked to judge art shows, and exhibited nationally and internationally.

This exhibit of her few remaining paintings may be the last opportunity the public has to purchase one of her original works.

BJ defined her work as follows: "The common thread that runs through all my works is the continuing challenge of forcing relationships between things that don't naturally 'go together' – along with a strong interest in color and structure – the things that hold a work together that you hardly ever notice. And if no strong relationships exist, it's great fun to invent some!"

This exhibit will run from Wednesday February 20 through Sunday March 17, 2019. A reception open to the public, will be held on Saturday, March 23 from 3-5PM at The Gallery, 127 N. Main Ave, Fallbrook, which is operated by the Fallbrook Art Association.
